Meningococcal Vaccination Response Form

New York State Public Health Law 2167 **requires** all colleges to distribute information on meningococcal disease and the meningococcal vaccine. All college students enrolled in 6 or more credits on campus, must complete this form and return it. Failure to submit the form will result in administrative withdrawal from courses.

Clinton Community College does not offer this vaccine. The meningococcal meningitis vaccine may be available from your health care provider or from Clinton County Health Department. The cost of this vaccine at the Health Department is currently \$10 for those with no health insurance. CCHD accepts the following insurance plans: Fidelis and NYS Medicaid, and it is \$132 for those with insurance but he/she must submit their own insurance claim form. Prices are subject to change.

Student Immunization Requirements

New York State Public Health Law 2165 **requires** all college students born on or after January 1, 1957 and enrolled in 6 or more credits on campus to submit documentation of immunity to measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR). Failure to comply with New York State immunization requirements will result in administrative withdrawal from courses.

The immunization requirements:

Measles (Rubeola)

- Two doses of a measles vaccine or 2 attenuated live MMR vaccines at least 28 days apart. The first dose administered no more than 4 days before the first birthday and given on/or after January 1, 1968.
- Physician's documented history of disease <u>OR</u> blood test/titer proving immunity. Copy of Laboratory Report must be submitted to the Health Office.

Mumps

- Single dose of mumps vaccine or an attenuated live MMR vaccine administered no more than 4 days before the first birthday and given on/or after January 1, 1969.
- Physician's documented history of disease <u>OR</u> blood test/titer proving immunity. Copy of Laboratory Report must be submitted to the Health Office.

Rubella (German measles)

- Single dose of rubella vaccine or an attenuated live MMR vaccine administered no more than 4 days before the first birthday and given on/or after January 1, 1969.
- Blood test/titer proving immunity. Copy of Laboratory Report must be submitted to the Health Office.
- Clinical diagnosis of rubella is <u>NOT</u> acceptable as proof of immunity

Acceptable Proof of Documentation of Immunizations:

- Vaccination/Immunization cards from childhood.
- Immunization records from your health care provider or clinic.
- Immunization records from college, high school or other schools attended.
- Copy of lab blood work/titer proving immunity to measles, mumps, and rubella.
- Certificate of immunization from INS or country of origin for international students; or
- Honorable discharge papers from military service, within 10 years of discharge, pending actual receipt of immunization records.

EXEMPTIONS: Students may request a medical exemption, it must be on office letterhead, include student's name, DOB, and the medical contraindication for not administering immunizations. The new legislation signed on June 13, 2019 did not change immunization requirements for college students they can still obtain a religious exemption. Forms may be obtained from the Health Office.
